Personal pronouns:

- **I** is always capitalised.
- **She** always points out a female.
- **They** is used for you talk about several people.
- **It** always points out a thing.
- **You** can point out three different things.

Object pronouns:

- **Her** always points out a single female person.
- **Him** always points out a single male person.
- **Them** points out several people.

Possessive pronouns:

- Indicates to whom or to what something belongs.
- **Its** is only used for non-human things. E.g: *Look at the cow! Its leg is hurt.*
- **Its** is not the same as **it's** (= it is).
- Don't mistake **your** for **you're** (= you are).
- Don't mistake **his** for **he's** (= he is).
